

Below is a detailed comparison of the roles of Volunteer, Member, and Board Member roles within the Rachell L. Gray Community Foundation. This chart outlines their responsibilities, benefits, and commitments.

Definition	Individuals who provide time and skills with no compensation to support the foundation's mission.	Individuals who join the foundation, often contributing through dues and active participation.	Elected individuals who govern the foundation and provide strategic leadership.

Commitment Level	Flexible commitment: volunteers can choose how much time to dedicate.	Moderate commitment: members are expected to engage regularly in activities and events.	High commitment: board members must attend meetings and contribute to strategic planning.
Benefits	Opportunities to gain experience, network with others, and contribute to community initiatives.	Same as a volunteer. Access to special items, participation in exclusive events, and networking opportunities with other members.	Same as a volunteer and member. Influence over the foundation's direction, recognition within the community, and the opportunity to make significant contributions.
Community Impact	Directly support to community initiatives and programs through hands-on work.	Help fund and promote community events, enhancing the foundation's outreach and impact.	Shape the foundation's mission and goals, ensuring long-term sustainability and effectiveness in serving the community.
